Apples and Oranges my friends. Apples and Oranges. They are not the same. They may seem similar, but they are not the same. With that thought in mind, modern versions and the Apostle Paul. They change most doctrines for the other Apostles to a point, but they truly change the doctrinal base for the members of the Body of Christ, in the Dispensation of the Grace of God.

Please note the scripture comparisons and take note of changes.

1 Corinthians 11:1 (KJV) Be ye followers of me, even as I also *am* of Christ.

ASV 1Co 11:1 Be ye imitators of me, even as I also am of Christ.

DARBY 1Co 11:1 Be my imitators, even as *I* also *am* of Christ.

EMTV 1Co 11:1 Be imitators of me, just as I also *am* of Christ.

ESV 1Co 11:1 Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ.

GNB 1Co 11:1 Imitate me, then, just as I imitate Christ.

GWNV 1Co 11:1 Imitate me as I imitate Christ.

ISV 1Co 11:1 Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ.

LTV 1Co 11:1 Be imitators of me, as I *am* also of Christ.

MURDOCK 1Co 11:1 Be ye imitators of me, as I am of the Messiah.

WNTV 1Co 11:1 Be imitators of me, in so far as I in turn am an imitator of Christ.

Now in following Pauline Doctrine, we are to follow Paul's examples as well as what he says we are to do, as well as not do. Paul was a Jew. He was circumcised the 8th day, from the tribe of Benjamin. So let me ask you this, are you to imitate those aspects of Paul? I am certainly not going to do so. I am not a Jew. We are not to copy him or imitate him. We are to follow his doctrines and his teachings as he received knowledge from God which nobody else got. That's the Revelation of the Mystery. Kept secret since the world began.

Ephesians 3:2 (KJV) If ye have heard of the dispensation of the grace of God which is given me to you-ward:

Dispensation = Time period of dispensing or giving with out charge.

BBE Eph 3:2 If that ordering of the grace of God has come to your knowledge, which was given to me for you,

CEV Eph 3:2 You have surely heard about God's kindness in choosing me to help you.

DARBY Eph 3:2 (if indeed ye have heard of the administration of the grace of God which has been given to me towards you,

EMTV Eph 3:2 assuming that you have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for you,

GNB Eph 3:2 Surely you have heard that God in his grace has given me this work to do for your good.

WNT Eph 3:2 if, that is, you have heard of the work which God has graciously entrusted to me for your benefit,

LITV Eph 3:2 if, indeed, you heard of the stewardship of the grace of God given to me for you,

ISV Eph 3:2 Surely you have heard about the responsibility of administering God's grace that was given to me on your behalf,

GWNV Eph 3:2 Certainly, you have heard how God gave me the responsibility of bringing his kindness to you.

Now, There are, for the record, some modern versions who do use the word "Dispensation", and the Devil planned it that way. Some one may say well the word "Dispensation" is in this version, so it has just got to be the Word of God. Apple and Oranges my friends. Similar but not the same. Now the verses we are looking at here from the modern bibles that do not use the word Dispensation, actually tell us something. The verse we first looked at, 1 Corinthians 11:1, in the modern bibles say "imitators". So what? Look at Ephesians 3: in the modern bibles. What do you see? WORKS! Stewardship, responsibility, administration, they are all forms or works. If you are imitating, you are imitating a mans works to get in God's good graces, or to get right with God. Works will not do it friends. Imitations will not satisfy God. Imitations are all fakes. They are not rooted from the heart. They are fashioned in your flesh, and flesh can not please God. He had a body of flesh in Jesus Christ, and He did not please himself, but the Father. He did not give in to the Devil. If all you are doing is imitating, then that is probably all that you have. If you have not believed on the Lord Jesus Christ with your heart, it is all an imitation. Won't you simply, with your heart,

If you picked one or more of the above items, you failed the test. Don't feel badly though, most people do fail. Most are to some degree "religious"; but religions are nothing more than man-made attempts to reach God.

The real answer of how to get to Heaven is not found in some religious system or by man's self-righteousness. God has declared that "there is none righteous, no not one" (Romans 3:10). "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God". (Romans 3:23).

Further, God's Word teaches that sin is a very serious matter. 2 Thessalonians 1:9 tells of "everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord."

What can you do about your sin problem? Can you clean up your life, do good works and hope that in the end your good works will outweigh your bad works? **NO!** Salvation

does not come to those who work for it, but to those who cease from their own works, placing their trust in the Lord Jesus Christ. Romans 4:5 makes that point abundantly clear: "To him that worketh not, but believeth on Him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness." In Ephesians 2:8-9, it is declared, "For by grace are ye saved through faith: and that not of yourselves, it is a gift of God, not of works lest any man should boast."

The issue is not what you can do for God, but what He has done for you. "But God commends His love toward us in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). "He hath made Him (Jesus) to be sin for us, Who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him" (2 Corinthians 5:21). You have no righteousness of your own. To have eternal life you must have the righteousness of Christ (see Romans 3:26).

What then is your responsibility? God has given you a free will to either accept or reject what He has done for you. To have God's righteousness, you must believe that "Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures; and that He was buried; and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures" (1 Corinthians 15:3,4).

Your response to the gospel should be as we read of the Ephesians: "In Whom (the Lord Jesus Christ) ye also trusted, after ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in Whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that Holy Spirit of Promise" (Ephesians 1:13). This seal is a guarantee that your salvation is eternal--you can never lose it (see Ephesians 1:14, 4:30; 2 Corinthians 1:22).
